Mission Statement

Providing ambulance service to the residents and visitors of Gordon and Wascott since 1958. Staffed by nationally registered and state licensed Emergency Medical Technicians with the support of skilled Emergency Medical Responder (1st responders). Working in cooperation with all area hospitals and advanced life support helicopter services to provide AFFORDABLE emergency and non-emergency transport and medical care.

There are two fully equipped ambulances in service 24- hours/day, 7-days/week, 365-days/year. Each ambulance is equipped with an Automatic Defibrillator Unit. Both units are ready for emergency and non-emergency transport and medical care.

Gordon-Wascott EMS Would like to take the time to thank the Town Boards of Gordon and Wascott, the members of the service, the residents and all the visitors to Gordon and Wascott. Without all of your support we would not be able to serve our residents and visitors.

The service has been working hard in the last year (2024). Items that have and are being worked on:

- 1. Recruiting new members we have added 3 new members to the service.
- 2. Updated training we do an inhouse flex refresher every month for training. This allows us to cut costs to the taxpayers of Gordon and Wascott.
- 3. Members have advanced in training by becoming instructors with LCO College, Northwood Technical College and APHE (certified CPR instructors).
- 4. Updated our CPR class to be able to instruct in the public for American Heart BLS provider, Layperson CPR, and Friends and Family (babysitter) CPR. We can teach Bloodborne Pathogens to your workplace or Fire Department. If you would like more information on the course we offer please feel free to reach us at the above phone number and email.
- 5. We have implemented a new system for quality control, inventory, and tracking. (Out with the old and in with the new)
- 6. We started taking on more Special Events in our surrounding area for a minimal fee. Please feel free to reach out to us for details. We will always do "911" emergencies first, this way we do not leave our communities without an ambulance service. The Special Event allows us to generate some dollars to help subsidize a small portion of our budget. Our goal is to help in every way possible to keep costs down for the town residents.
- 7. We are working hard with the town boards to update our policies and procedures. Thus making it easy for the boards to come to understand the workings of Gordon-Wascott EMS.

What the future looks like in our eye's:

- 1. Continuing with education this way we are always updated on all the new skills, equipment, education and procedures to better serve our communities.
- 2. Implementing a wellness program this way our members are always ready physically and mentally to handle all emergencies.
- 3. Adding some outside training emergency medical training on our 4 legged family members, training mental health, fall awareness, and training with outside agencies.

Last year we had 195 emergency medical responses. 88 town of Gordon, 91 town of Wascott, 16 Mutual aid for other agencies.
